Subject: Loss of support from DNR field foresters

Dear Secretary Stepp:

With Governor Walker's recent budget proposal, Wisconsin's private woodland owners are faced with another possibility that they will lose even more support from their county field foresters.

Field forester positions have been reduced from 100 FTE just a few years ago to only 69 FTE positions today, now making up only 11% of the positions funded by the forestry account. With proposed budget cuts, an additional 4 positions are targeted for elimination.

WAFO supports efforts to streamline government and is not opposed to position cuts when the ends justify the means. While many of the non-field forestry positions provide valuable service to the state, we feel that if positions must be cut, they be balanced against the many benefits county foresters provide in helping landowners grow their long term crop.

County foresters are the first point of contact for most private woodland owners looking for professional advice on how to better manage their timber resources. They understand that landowners have varied management objectives which need to be balanced with the goal of bringing timber to the market. They've shown willingness to work extra hours and attend various educational events and field demonstrations sponsored by woodland organizations. We believe your field foresters are key to helping our private landowners grow and market their timber resources.

Private landowners have seen a dramatic loss of support over the years from DNR field staff. When combined with increased MFL entry costs and increasingly stringent regulatory requirements, it has become much more difficult for landowners to be able to justify keeping their timber land given the options available to parcel it off for development or to divert it to other agricultural uses.
